Sean Jacobs is Assistant Professor of Communication Studies and Afroamerican and African Studies at the University of Michigan. Professor Jacobs, a native of Cape Town, South Africa, holds a Ph.D. in Politics from the University of London. He is working on a book on the role of media in the transition to liberal democracy in South Africa. His research interests are media and political power, citizenship, social movements, and popular culture. Before coming to the University of Michigan, he was a postdoctoral fellow of the International Center for Advanced Studies at New York University. He is co-editor of Thabo Mbeki's World: The Politics and Ideology of the South African President (Zed Books, 2002) and two other books. His most recent scholarly articles have appeared in Politique Africaine (2006) and Media, Culture, and Society (2007). He also regularly contributes journalism and opinion to publications including The Mail & Guardian (South Africa), The Nation, Chimurenga, and Africa Confidential.
